The Industrial Revolution European Society and

Price Production and its consequences had integral relation with 17th century crisis.

Economy: End of 16th Century with old ideas, state system, Economy and Politics; Conflict between 16th c- philosophy and 17th century - new ideas; influenced the entire horizon of society - it has become so deep-rooted that it is difficult for European countries to exist/survive within 16th c. framework.

Economy: 17th c. Economic crisis had tremendous effect on various states of Europe. Domenance of Netherlands and England was very much evident.

During this century the hegemony of Italy, Portugal and Spain came to a close and overwhelming dominance of Britain, France and Netherlands began due to colonial preoccupation, p. 12.

Crisis of Population in England West Mediterranean

Brandel, Ladrill, Peter Cletz (Historians) opined great Economic transformation brought a root change in entire economic sphere. Gradual loss of population was one of the foremost reason for Economic crisis followed by great Economic Change. Question arises was it the root cause of 17th c. crisis?
